Donna & I had the opportunity and I may say, the privilege, of being with the congregation of Iglesia Cristiana de Amarillo. We have a bond of love and fellowship in Christian service with the leaders and all participants in this church. Only salvation, in the first place, through Jesus Christ compares with this feeling. Enrique Meza- the minister- is from Juarez, Mexico; saved by the blood of Jesus; trained by studying the Bible at home and classes at the Juarez Bible Institute. He is solid in the word of God and blessed with talent to preach and teach the Bible. People listen when he talks. The lesson on the day we were there was from Nicodemus, "You must be born again." This was thoroughly explained and the discussions from the group were very interesting. It is a great blessing from God, that some of the Meza children help at the church. Two sons liven up the praise team with guitars; along with a drummer, while Sharon Meza leads singing.

We saw samples of almost every tract that Spanish American Evangelistic Ministries ever printed, displayed at the church entrance. We learned that Amarillo is a difficult field for the Gospel, because Hispanics there are worldly-minded; very materialistic. Some work up to 80 hours per week and then, blow their money on sinful things and immorality. Pray for more souls to be saved through Iglesia Cristiana de Amarillo.
