In June, we reported the welcomed visit from a group of hard working brothers and sisters in Christ from OK. We wish we could say that our mission has been busy in the “greeting of groups” department, but sadly, this summer this group has been the only one to visit, stay, and work on our campus. They were disappointed, I know, that they were not allowed by their church elders to go into Juarez. They support various pastors and miss seeing and having fellowship with them. The violence in our sister city across the Rio Grande continues. It has become a daily event for 3 or 4 persons to get killed; that it is not even news worthy—according to the broadcasting people. We, at SAEM learn the sad news from the brave Christians who live over there and who visit our mission to carry back our evangelizing tracts. They share with us sad events within their churches; such as the young man that was shot and killed when after Sunday church activities, he stepped outside the church to go around the corner to a store and purchase sodas for their fellowship that was to follow. Apparently, extortionists were in the store collecting their “fee for protection”, from the store owner and for whatever reason - upset over the outcome of their visit; they opened fire. We pray along with the people in Juarez, that God will bring the solution to this bloodshed and will restore love and peace to those who know Him —and may He grant the opportunity to all who need to know Him.
