Thanks to you, because you pray, and God answers, we have been safely conducted across this strategic border to Mexico, doing our bit to carry out God's will. Knowing that He is not willing that any should perish, but all would be saved to everlasting life in heaven with Him. The brothers and sisters in Juarez have been encouraged to keep up the good fight of faith. People are learning to grow in the evangelical way, in Mexico that is in contrast to Catholicism, a person is either evangelical or Catholic, these are the terms which are used.

God is good to us. We bring in scriptures for distribution and offerings of benevolent items to ward off poverty.

At one church of the Lord Jesus Christ we talked with the minister and his wife about the attendance on Sunday's, swelling out to the side walls, and to the back of the chapel, and needing to push out the wall and extend the building about 15' clear to the street right of way. Already work groups from the states have worked on a combination Sunday school class room and kitchen, and made two restrooms and a cement patio floor. So there is more progress there, and we desire to keep it going.

A nice projection machine is being employed at this location, run through a computer, which was donated too. It is operated by the ministers' son, who plays guitar and sings with the music group of the church. Time marches on and so do we in the cause of Christ.
